CRACKER BOX PALACE LARGE ANIMAL SANCTUARY AND RESCUE FARM IN ALTON, NEW YORK OUR CHARITY OF THE MONTH



In May we will be supporting Cracker Box Palace Farm Animal Rescue and Sanctuary in Alton New York. This sanctuary is open to the public and has over 300 animals of all kinds for adoption and for “no kill care” which means animals not adopted will live their full lives in a loving and caring environment. CBP has horses, cows, sheep, goats, rabbits, chickens, ducks, geese, pigs, peacocks and more.

Visiting CBP is like going to an animal park. It has picnic tables and activities to participate in. Plenty to entertain you with. The view overlooking Sodus Bay is awesome!!

Cheri Roloson, the founder has been awarded a proclamation of appreciation from Senator Pam Helming for her hard work and dedication to animal rescue and care.

Cheri Roloson, of Williamson, began rescuing abused, neglected, and otherwise unwanted horses and farm animals in the home she shared with her husband, Robert Madison, and two young daughters in 2000. The following year, Cracker Box Palace Farm Animal Haven officially opened as a not-for-profit, no-kill farm animal shelter. By 2004, the shelter outgrew the 48-acre farm and moved to Historic Alasa Farms, where the shelter leased barns and pastures. After a tragic fire at the main house in 2009, the farm was at risk of being sold and Cracker Box Palace was worried about where they might move over 250 animals. The organization worked to purchase and restore the farm and buildings.

Cheri commits her time as the Director of the organization, working full-time directing day-to-day operations, finances, staffing, and long-term planning without receiving a salary for her efforts. With the help of the school, she created the STEADY Work program to provide at-risk teens with their first job, helping them finish high school, earn their GEDs, and learn important life skills.

In her role as an advocate for animals, Cheri also advises the Wayne County District Attorney's Office with caring for large farm animals when they are involved in animal cruelty cases and also testifies in court when needed. She organized the Large Animal Response Team at the request of Wayne County Emergency Management in 2006 and coordinates with the County Animal Response Team and ESART.

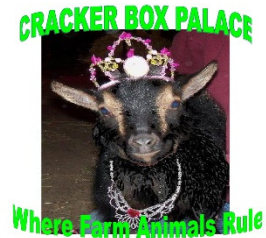
Her nominator writes, "Friends and family tried to discourage Cheri from the big undertaking of starting a farm animal shelter, as it seemed impossible for one person to accomplish." The farm currently cares for over 300 animals, both large and small, and employs four paid staff and dozens of volunteers.
